



# Shriners Children's Texas Hospital CONSTRUCTION UPDATES:

As of 8/9/2024 - The standing seam roof work is completed. Water testing of the window system continues. The exterior cement board is complete, except for the balconies for the visiting professionals, parents and between the parent house and garage. Prep work is being done for the canopies that will be installed in these areas. The parent house elevator installation is still ongoing. The parking garage traffic coating is near completion. The ramps are being built at night to avoid the day traffic of construction workers. The piers are being installed to support the canopy system from the parent housing and garage to the vestibule. Sidewalks have been poured on the north and west side of the parking garage, Post office street and the breezeway between the parent house and garage. Substantial completion of the project is now scheduled for the week of 9/19/24.

The Stated Meeting will begin at 7:30pm. Voting members must be in "Good Standing" and must present a Shrine Card before being admitted.

The following section of the bylaws of the Imperial Council, Shriners International, is quoted for information and compliance: §325.11 Election Regulations.

### (a)Electioneering

A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine Temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidate for office in the temple is prohibited.

### (b)Expenditures Prohibited

The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

### (c)Violation

promote his candidacy.

For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officer's void and order a new election.

At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

### ANNUAL ELECTION OF OFFICERS: ORIENTAL GUIDE MUST BE SELECTED WISELY

When the members of a Shrine Temple elect a Noble to the Office of Oriental Guide, they are virtually starting that Noble through the Divan Line on the assumption that he will prove qualified for and worthy of advancement to the high office of Illustrious Potentate. Hence it is quite evident that the nomination for Oriental Guide should be based upon thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability, prestige, interest and experience. A Noble can be a good fellow, a hard worker, and a loyal Shriner...and yet lack the basic qualification which make a good Potentate. Unless a Noble is fully qualified for the job, he is unfair both to himself and to his Temple in seeking the Office or in permitting his fellow Nobles to support and

Each Shrine Temple needs and requires able, high-type leadership. The normal starting point of that leadership is the office of Oriental Guide. The following Check List may prove helpful in evaluating potential candidates for the office of Oriental Guide. However, no thinking man would be so naïve or presumptuous as to believe that anyone Noble could possible embody all of the virtues, talents and qualifications which are set forth in this checklist. Nevertheless, the List has practical value for self-evaluation by the Nobles whose ultimate aspiration in the office of Illustrious Potentate...And for advance evaluation of potential candidates by the voting members.

- 1. He should have good business judgement. He should be friendly and outgoing, a good mixer.
- 2. He should have the ability to express himself clearly
- 3. He should present an imposing personal appearance.
- 4. He should be able to hold his own and advance the interest of his Temple and Freemasonry.
- 5. He should be a devoted Mason, and constantly promote the interests of Freemasonry everywhere
- 6. He should be proud and humble
- 7. He should have a good character and a past open to investigation.
- 8. He should be a leader, have good standing in his community and be influential in its affairs.
- 9. He should be financially secure
- 10. He should be in good health, full of energy and vitality.
- 11. He should be able to devote ample time to his duties.
- 12. He should be a man who, when he appears anywhere in public, you will be proud of and not apologetic for shortcomings.
- 13. His wife should be able to understand his devotion to duty, realize that he his Potentate, and not she. Be able to dress and wear appropriate clothing and be familiar with the social amenities. Remember, she is destined to become Suez First Lady.

Nominations for Oriental Guide should be based upon thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability and interest. Remember, you are electing your spokesman and standard bearer and the one who will represent you throughout the world. We have great talent in our Temple. Let us seek out the best man we can find who is willing to make that sacrifice... and it requires great sacrifice! Many Temples have suffered from inferior Potentates because of hasty judgement and oversight of qualifications when selecting Oriental Guides. To be Potentate of Suez is a great honor. With that honor comes tremendous responsibility. He and his Lady will be devoting the next 5 years of their lives to the betterment of our Temple and to Shriners. The job requires and entails a lot of time-consuming WORK. Let's get the very best we can find!
